PETER FRESHWATER is a former Deputy University Librarian of Edinburgh University, and a founder member of the BACS Library and Resources Group, succeeding Donald Simpson as its Convenor until his own retirement in 1999. He edited *Canadian resources in Scottish libraries: proceedings of a seminar held on 11 December 1981* (Edinburgh, 1982), compiled a guide to *Edinburgh for Canadians* (Edinburgh, 2000), and is researching early Canadian students at Edinburgh University.

ALAN HALLSWORTH is a member of the Board of the Foundation and was President of BACS 1998–2000. He is Professor Emeritus, Staffordshire University and Reader in Management, University of Surrey, and has held all the honorary posts of the Association. This in turn generated a successful conference at Canada House on behalf of the Business Studies Group of BACS – which he Chairs.

TIM ROTH, Professor Emeritus, University of Portsmouth, is Treasurer of BACS and was President from 2000–2004. His research interests have focused on British and Canadian external economic relations in the twentieth century. He has published in a wide range of journals and is author of *British Protectionism and the International Economy* (Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 2002).

DR ROY TODD, Visiting Research Fellow in the School of Sociology and Social Policy at the University of Leeds, is a former Director of the University of Leeds Centre for Canadian Studies. He has held visiting appointments at the University of British Columbia, the University of Toronto and in Canadian Studies at Universidade Aberta, Lisbon. His publications include *Aboriginal People and Other Canadians: Shaping New Relationships* (Ottawa: University of Ottawa Press, 2001).
